Neil Moore-Smith writes...

Promises

It was wonderful to see my daughter Clare marry her partner Ray in September. Walking her down the aisle was a very special moment; Clare was nervous but excited, so it was a real pleasure to be there for her. She looked beautiful, of course.

Being a minister, I also had the pleasure of conducting the ceremony, which led to some amusement when it came to the part where I asked “Who gives this woman...?” and then nipped round to Clare’s side, to say “I do!”

But, for me, the best part was leading them through their vows. In legal terms, they only have to say “I take you to be my lawful wedded wife/husband”; that’s enough to get the “piece of paper” that says they are married, and is pretty much all that happens when you get married in a registry office. But Clare and Ray went on to promise each other “to have and to hold from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish until death do us part.”

In other words, they promised to love each other and to stay together – whatever the circumstances – for life.

I’m not saying that couples who marry in a registry office don’t intend to do the same, or that all church marriages last forever; or, indeed, that couples who live together don’t have the same commitment.

But there is a difference between having good intentions and making solemn promises. A wedding really is more than just getting “a piece of paper”.

Importantly, Clare and Ray made their vows before God. Christians believe that God, as creator, has made us to be happiest in a lifelong, committed marriage, and will bless us and help us to fulfil our promises. At times, we certainly need his help!

Clare and Ray lived together and had Finley (who made a very sweet page boy) before they got married. I’m glad that they decided to make these promises to each other. Perhaps someone reading this might decide to do the same. Or perhaps someone who got married in a registry office might want a simple ceremony that includes the promises. NEWS

From Wolston Parish Council

People who regularly attend Parish Council meetings could be forgiven for feeling a sense of frustration, or that they are taking part in a version of “Groundhog Day” - where the same topics are addressed month after month, with often little or no tangible evidence of progress. However, it is always gratifying when Councillors can report when things have moved forward or even been resolved.

As users of the Recreation Ground on Dyers Lane will be aware, there has been a spate of malicious vandalism aimed at the new play and recreational health gym equipment resulting in one of the swings having to be removed. As reported last month several quotations for a digital CCTV system were awaited so that a decision could be taken on which company to engage. It was pleasing that the Councillors had three quotations from which to choose, at the September meeting, and that the specification includes some night vision capability. There is no other option to employ since securing the site is not possible because of the access currently available from Dyers Lane, Brook Street, and the Baptist Cemetery. You will all realise that money spent repairing the vandalised equipment is money that can't be used elsewhere. Can we ask that if you see anyone damaging the equipment that you report it to the Police, the Community Safety Wardens, or the Parish Council Clerk or Chairman? On a happier note, I recently saw a young family who had expended some energy - some getting fit using the outdoor gym equipment and the younger member enjoying the new play equipment, they were tidying up litter and “feeding” the “bear” bin what they had picked up. I know that we often have dog walkers who clear up litter they find on the park as well, so a big thank you to those people who care enough to do so.

A question recently asked was about who is actually responsible for clearing the brook which runs through the village? This is addressed by guidance on the Environment Agency website, but briefly under common law the responsibility for maintaining the flow in any watercourse rests with the “riparian owner” that is the owner of land or property adjacent to a river or other watercourse. This means that when the Environment Agency can't justify work, they will look to the riparian owner to do the work. If your land boundary is next to the watercourse it is assumed that you own the land up to the centre of the watercourse, unless it is owned by someone else. If a watercourse runs alongside your garden wall you should check your property deeds to see if the wall marks your boundary or the watercourse marks the boundary. When decisions have to be taken on work which residents want done then consideration has to be given not only to the physical impact of not doing it, or arranging for it to be done, but also to who will pick up the cost.

A resident who has lived in the village for 83 years raised concerns about the failure of the Parish Council's contractors to clear the grass cuttings from the

footpaths when they have cut the verges. The Clerk had contacted the contractors' manager and reported the shortcomings and had also sent a copy of a photograph showing the dreadful state in which the pavement had been left. The resident was thanked for raising the issue and given assurances that action would be taken to ensure there would be improvements to the service being delivered.

The Wolston Youth Project is now in its sixth year of operation. The Parish Council decided to run a Youth Project staffed with qualified youth workers, following the closure of the Youth Club, run by Warwickshire County Council, in the last round of cuts to their Youth Services. The Youth Project has seen an increase in the younger membership with Year 6s from Wolston St Margaret's attending. The Youth Project provides a range of activities such as pool, table tennis, laptops with internet access to enable young people to use social media as well as complete schoolwork, table top activities such as arts and crafts and traditional games such as scrabble, etc. Cake and biscuit decoration has been very popular over this year and there is also football on the all-weather pitch. Over the next 12 months the staff team will continue to work to provide an environment where the young people feel safe, with the emphasis on building relationships, enhancing their social skills and supporting their transition to adulthood and on to become valued members of the community of Wolston village.

The Wolston Youth Project has been the recipient of an exceptionally kind and generous donation, thanks to the Open Gardens Committee which has included the Wolston Youth Project in the list of recipients of money raised on the Gardens Walkabout in 2017. Their support is very much appreciated, especially since the Youth Project had previously received a donation from the Open Gardens Committee 2 years ago, following the last Gardens Walkabout in 2015.

Thanks to Roger Ingles and Francis Smiton for coming to talk to the parish councillors about the work being planned on the Allotment Gardens 12 acre site located between Stretton Road and Warwick Road. The site, owned by the Wilcox Trust and leased to Wolston Parish Council is tenanted by Wolston and Brandon Allotment and Gardens Association members who do an excellent job of maintaining the site and identifying areas for improvement. We congratulate them for the projects they have instigated to make sure that the best use is made of the land so that currently unusable areas and vacant plots can be brought back into use quickly. They are also planting trees in a memorial orchard and repairing and strengthening hedgerows. We hope that the village will support their fundraising events and wish them every success in their efforts.

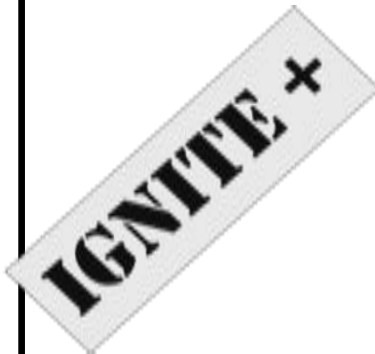

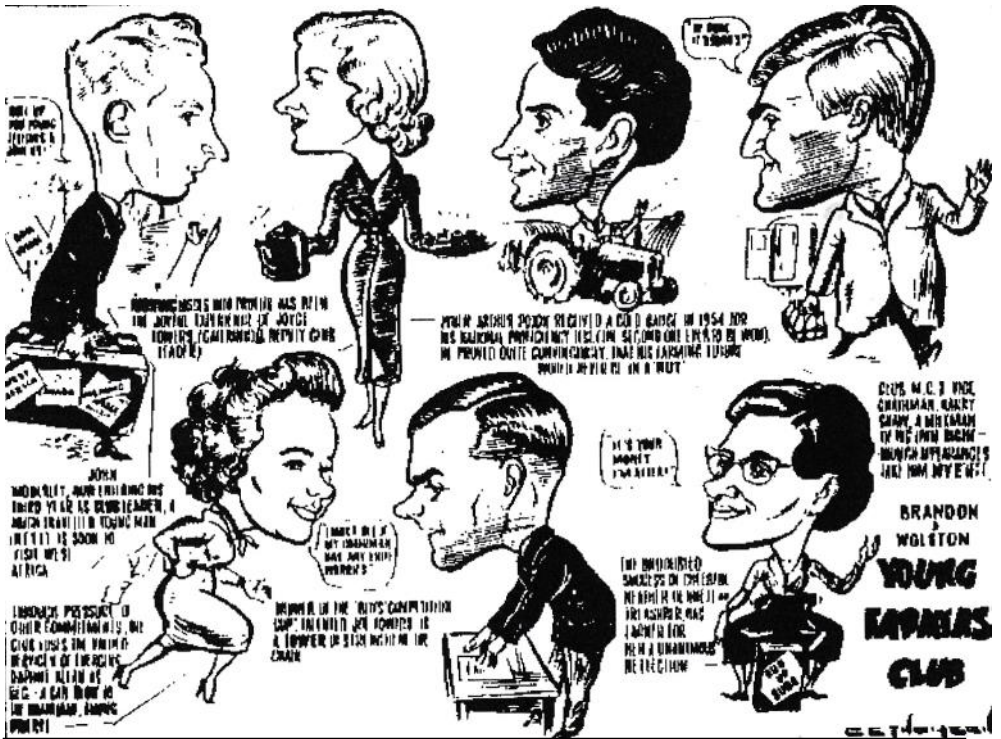

This cartoon appeared in the Sunday Mercury featuring the officers of the Wolston and Brandon Young Farmers Club in 1955. Top left we have **John Hiderley**, the poultry farmer carrying his suitcase having been travelling to Canada on a Young Farmers Scholarship, West Africa on a YMCA travel scholarship as well as representing the Mayor of Rugby on a visit to Evereux, Rugby's twin town on the occasion of the opening of their Gymkhana where he addressed a crowd of 4,000 people in French. Next is **Joyce Towers** who handled refreshments and catering at meetings Next **Arthur Poxon** who was then farm manager on a farm at Stretton owned by Dr Yardley a local benefactor who also paid for the shelter that used to stand on The Derry. Arthur then had his own farm in Brinklow and worked with John Hiderley on the arable side of his farm. Top right featuring **Harry Shaw** working as a dairy man he was branch vice chairman. His dairy business eventually became Harry Shaw Travel and with its coaches that we see around today. There are still some milk churns around with his name on. On the bottom left is **Daphne Allen** who became NFU area secretary and Michael Chicken the current NFU branch secretary was appointed as her assistant. **Joe Towers** in the middle was then Branch chairman and is standing officiating at the table at a meeting. **Heather Dennett** was then the branch treasurer and later became a qualified accountant.

Wolston Manor Spinney – Wolston Conservation Group

Since the installation of the wooden entry bridge over the ha ha in April and additional paths, it is noticeable how many more people are enjoying a walk through the Spinney. The old main entrance estate gate, which has now been restored, was returned to its rightful place just in time for the Garden Walkabout! The volunteers have been busy planting native hedging and small trees, now there is space and light as a result of removing some of the self set sycamores, as well as maintaining the paths and verge running alongside the lane to the church.

We are planning to remove more of the self-set sycamores and do some tree pruning this winter and also to repair the wall at the church end of the Spinney. We are also going to erect an information board at the main entrance to the Spinney.

Brandon Village Matters

Brandon Village Matters is a campaigning group of residents. It seeks to preserve the important aspects of the ancient rural villages in the parish of Brandon and Bretford and to promote measures and policies that will protect and enhance the lives of people who live in them.

The Traffic Problem

A survey we conducted some time ago, confirmed by research that was undertaken for the formulation of the Neighbourhood Plan (NHP), shows that top of the list of problems affecting villagers (and the wider parish) day to day are a direct result of the volume and speed of traffic in a road system not designed to cope with it. The problems include: noise, dangerous junction, blind bends and difficult-to-cross roads.

As a response we have identified some simple measures that could be pursued immediately, which would ameliorate the impact. The measures we are proposing are not contemplated in the draft NHP but can be viewed as useful in their own right. They include pursuing a lowering of the speed limit on the village streets and some calming measures such as carriageway boundary marking by posts and ultimately some re-engineering of junctions.

At the recent meeting of the Brandon and Bretford Council we formally asked for support in the pursuit of these objectives. The council will debate the matters at its next meeting in November and we will report back when the outcome is known.

The Wolston NDP had a stall at the Family BBQ hosted at the Wolston and Brandon allotment site. It was set up as a relaxing area with occasional chairs to allow people to sit and chat. There was an activity table with our NDP mood cards, leaflets, sweets and toys for the children, alongside our community bunting that was added to! I was able to speak with allotment owners and more new mood cards were submitted. Highlights from the mood cards were as follows: The caring community feel, love of open green spaces and the allotments. There were calls for a café, bakers and butchers to be added to the village and there were concerns regarding extra building / large housing estates. In conversation we discussed the results of the HNS survey and they conveyed that they were not opposed to extra housing - just not too many large estates given that the infrastructure of the village could not cope. Also discussed was that it is not required according to HNS results.

All in all I felt that it was a successful evening with time well spent. The residents seemed supportive of the NDP and were encouraged that there are people willing to work to get this in place. In the words of one resident, "It's good to see you doing something, rather than some of us that just moan and do nothing".

The sowing the seeds for change seed packets proved popular once again. I look forward to seeing Wolston flocked in hollyhocks next year!

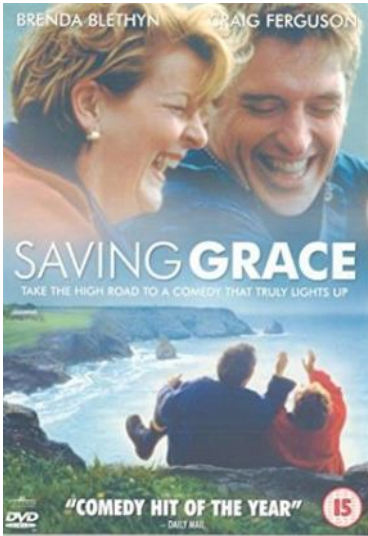

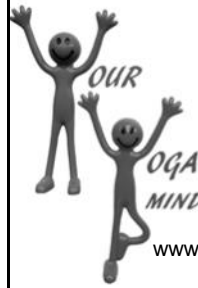

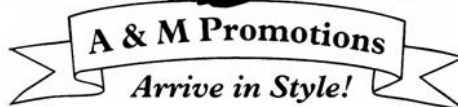
