# Annual Report 2018/19



## Message from the Mayor



I have an overall feeling of optimism for our town. I have to thank my fellow town councillors, who give their time and efforts, unpaid, to encourage the town to look ahead and to achieve a better future.

And also a huge ‘thank you’ to our excellent town council officers, our warden, groundsmen and cleaners for their hard work. This small team of staff help to keep us on the straight and narrow, providing professional guidance and a host of visible and behind-the-scenes services to the council and to the whole town.

We have increased our ground staff by two this year. This has already resulted in the improvement in our environment and the management of the town’s spaces and streets. Welcome Mark and Dan who alongside Ian and Craig have created a great team. The Town Council has made improvements to three roundabouts in the town – working in partnership with Trevena Cross Nurseries and other sponsors. Our maintenance of St Michaels Church Yard has progressed well with the aid of a volunteer group organised by Councillor Potter. Cornwall Council is pleased with the condition of the area and has extended the Service Level Agreement for another year.

With a fantastic array of volunteer groups and supporters putting their hearts behind some great projects to make the town look and feel good, I am really looking forward to the next 12 months and beyond.

We should recognise Helston in Bloom who have made and tended new flower beds, boxes and hanging baskets. And what a difference they make! They have shown what can be done if you just get on with it!



There are people all over the town who volunteer to ferry the elderly and disabled people to lunch clubs and afternoon sessions, events which combat loneliness and help create a busy social life for many who are not as independent as they used to be. We have a growing older population. So these are becoming more and more crucial to our community. Then there are the social clubs themselves, all run by warm-hearted volunteers.

I must take the opportunity now to thank the South Kerrier Alliance for their excellent work in restoring the Coronation Lake and Park. In particular I’d like to thank David Turnbull whose energy and commitment has resulted in a project that is now on view for all to see. I must encourage you all to use and support this excellent facility and to please look after this wonderful resource. It has no doubt restored a huge amount of pride and community spirit.

The formation of a brand new Helston CIC, a Community Interest Company, is very encouraging. It is led by good, enthusiastic community-minded people hoping to involve the different areas of our community in the future development of our town. There are projects now being considered and encouragement and support is sought from Cornwall Council and National Government. The most visible one at the moment is the new magazine ‘Discover Helston’. This is the first annual production which has been very well received.



The recently formed Helston Climate Action Group is actively engaging with the Town Council to encourage a Carbon Neutral Future for Helston and the surrounding Area. As a separate but related initiative the Town Council is committed to Plastic Free Helston and has led the formation of a steering group which is now meeting to determine the plan of action. Information is available on the Town Council’s website and we encourage everyone to support this initiative.

Of course our town is most famous for another event: Flora Day. The committee who organise this ancient event, The Flora Day Association, take on a very large responsibility: everything from the dances to the bunting going up in the streets. This magnificent event and others makes Helston a very special and unique place.

The coming year will see more major public events. Keep your eyes open for the publicity and please support them as much as you possibly can. Our sports clubs continue to succeed and encourage and develop the younger members of our community. Not forgetting our excellent scout, guides and cadet groups. I also need to thank all the church groups who do sterling work for our community.

Earlier this summer we launched the new Monument Markets, which have been initially monthly but may be held more often if proved to be popular. Please support this. Let's try and revive our historical status as a famous market town.



Our new Helston Community College building nears completion giving our students and staff long awaited modern facilities in which to study. Again after years of campaigning this is now a reality with students hoping to move in in September. Congratulations to all the staff and students.

The Helston Business Park is at last open for business, with additional units now being constructed attracting business and new jobs for Helston. We as councillors have worked hard to encourage this, and the town is now reaping the rewards of a hard campaign.

The Town Library in Trengrouse Car Park now houses not only the library but Cornwall Council's One-Stop Shop and the Job centre. It is becoming one of the most important centres for our community. Pooling these resources is not only saving money but is allowing a much valued resource to stay open longer. Again I must encourage everyone to use these facilities.

The new housing developments around Helston will not be to everyone's taste: displeasing to those who value our green-field environment; and welcome to those without homes and those who see enhanced prosperity in an enlarged town.

Like them or not, the developments are the result of directives from central government: places throughout England have been given quotas of new-build housing, much needed in a country where population growth has exceeded housing growth for generations.

You can see that 25 of the proposed 450 homes have been built on the new development on the left as you leave the town on the Falmouth Road. I'd like to think that eventually these new residential areas will make Helston more attractive to businesses and it will encourage growth and improvement to the town and its services.



It is stated that if every resident were to purchase something in the town worth 10 pounds every week it would generate up to 3 million pounds to our economy each year and contribute to securing the future of the town centre.

RNAS Culdrose Freedom Parade is on July 10th, when I look forward to seeing many of you enjoying bright summer sunshine to celebrate our links with that important and valued naval base. I would like to thank Captain Rimington for their continuing support and encouragement.



There is growing popularity for our unique Hellys International Guitar Festival, which is to be held in late August this year in the Old Cattle Market. This event is held in very high regard in national musical circles. Tickets are now available for this festival. There is a wonderful list of international renowned artists this year. I wish the festival every success in its third year.

And of course the Harvest Festival Weekend in September is something to look forward to. The ‘Helston Makes It’ event will follow soon after, based mainly at the museum.

Excited by this spirit of summer, and a collective pride in our wonderful celebration on Flora Day, which is recognised world-wide as a unique and important cultural event, we have a huge amount of work to do to secure the future of this lovely town.

I believe that everything is achievable, but it takes the effort of everyone in the town to make things happen. We cannot purely rely on a few dedicated people. It is crucial that the whole town get involved.

I am extremely proud to be mayor of this ancient and important town of Helston for a second year. Let’s give a warm welcome to our visitors this summer and let’s look forward to a positive year ahead.

## The Council

Helston Town Council was formed in 1974 and consists of 12 elected Councillors (5 Councillors represent the North Ward, 5 Councillors represent the South Ward and 2 Councillors represent the West Ward).

A list of current Councillors can be found on page 14. Elections are held every four years with the next in May 2021.

In February 2017 the Town Council was awarded Quality Gold status in the Local Council Award Scheme by the National Association of Local Councils. To date, Helston is the only council in Cornwall to receive this accolade and one of just 43 nationally. NALC states that Quality Gold *‘demonstrates that a council is at the forefront of best practice and achieves excellence in governance, community leadership and council development’*.



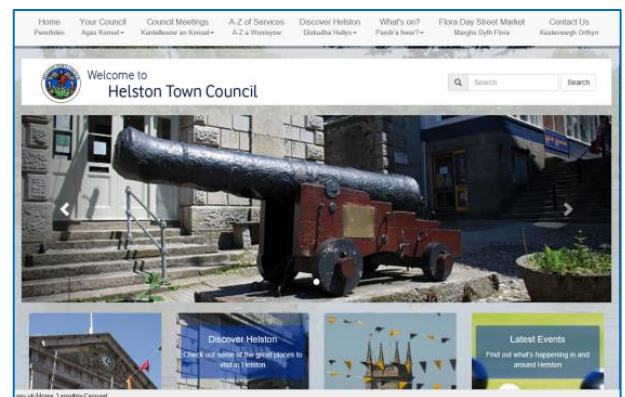

## Amenities Committee

The Committee was Chaired by Cllr Mrs Boase and met on six occasions during the 2018/19 civic year. The Committee is responsible for the Council's property such as the Guildhall, play parks and Public Conveniences as well as bus shelters, public seats and litter bins. It is also the Committee that manages town events.



*I would like to thank the Members for electing me as Chair for the past year. We have achieved some good results this year. St Michaels churchyard has had a makeover, with volunteers doing the majority of the work - paths have been cleared of the encroaching weeds & grass and weeds have been removed from the shrubs which have also been pruned. Thanks go to Cllr Potter for taking the lead on this project. All this has been achieved under the watchful eye of Ian Moore our Grounds/General maintenance Supervisor. Mr Moore keeps the weeds at bay in other areas of town and waters the flower beds. He also had a hand in re-planting the second roundabout which is flourishing despite being vandalised early on. Ian has been joined this April by two further Grounds/Maintenance Operatives. Our new team is currently working on our third roundabout on the Redruth Road which has been sponsored by PFS (Helston) Ltd and a donation was also received from Helston & District Rotary. We have had a new bench made and installed below the church steps as the previous one was rotten. The Keep Helston Tidy Working Party was re-instated during the year to work closely with the Helston in Bloom group.*

*I would like to thank Chris our Town Clerk for his perseverance with Cornwall Council in achieving the transference of the Monument Walk area to the Town Council. The area including the bowling green and Grylls Monument are now in the Town Council's ownership. The Council has already made good use of this public space by arranging a small market for the second Thursday of every month.*

## Planning Committee

The Planning Committee, consisting of seven Members meets on the first and third Thursday of every month and has delegated authority to consider all planning applications and to make recommendations to Cornwall Council – the Planning Authority. All Applications are categorised into those that are non-contentious (Category I) and those that require more in-depth consideration (Category II). Each Category II application is allocated to a Committee member who visits the site and contacts neighbours to establish a balanced view and to make a presentation and recommendation at the Planning Committee meeting. If a near neighbour of the application site cannot be contacted a letter is left giving the application details and how to contact the Committee member. The public are welcome to attend the meeting and again have the opportunity to express their opinions to the Members.

From June 2018 to May 2019, 40 Category I planning applications were considered and 36 Category II.





*The Planning Committee of Helston Town Council has had a wide variety of applications to consider and to make recommendations this year from somewhat contentious ones including removal of garages for additional housing and change of use for a retail unit through to more non-contentious applications such as a small single storey extension. Helston Business Park has continued to grow over the last year with the latest application recommended by the committee in April. As a committee we continue to ensure that the town's Conservation Area is recognised and that the heritage of the town is protected for both the present and future. Several members of the committee have completed additional training and development for their role this year which, with the addition of one committee member also being a Cornwall Councillor on the West Sub-Area Planning Committee, has continued to further develop the expertise and experience of our Town committee.*

## **Policy, Finance & Resources Committee**

The Policy, Finance and Resources Committee, consisting of eight Members, Chaired by Councillor Grattan-Kane, met on seven occasions during the year with meetings held on the second Tuesday of the month.

The Committee's functions include reviewing existing Council policies and risk assessments and the consideration of new policies. With regards to finance, the Committee regularly monitors the budget and considers reports of the independent internal auditor and the external auditor. Two members of the Committee regularly conduct audits of internal controls.

The Committee agrees a draft forward budget and determines the Precept for recommendation to Full Council each year.



Over the past year the Council has continued to maintain its effective system of internal and external audit. This ensures Council remains financially sound and works in accordance with recognised best practice. This year saw the Council increase the precept by 27.5% the first substantial increase for some time. However, this equates to an average of £133.18 p.a. for a band D council tax payer. This rise was in order to finance the increase in the grounds and maintenance staff as Helston Town Council took on work that had been devolved from Cornwall Council and previously contracted out. The increased charge still means that Helston remains 19<sup>th</sup> out of the 23 town councils in Cornwall and remains below the average charge for such bodies.

The Policy, Finance and Resources Committee will continue to ensure that the Council's activities are undertaken in an efficient, effective and economic manner.

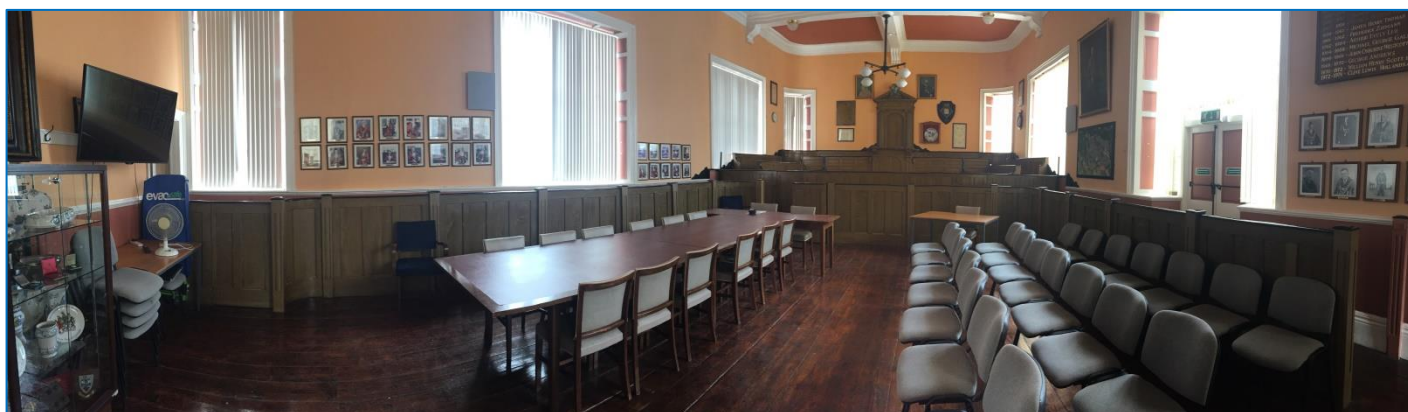

## Council Activities



May 2018 was a particularly busy month for the Council. On top of its 'normal' business we had the following:-

- 5<sup>th</sup> May 1<sup>st</sup> Guildhall wedding
- 8<sup>th</sup> May Flora Day
- 9<sup>th</sup> May Beating the Boundaries
- 14<sup>th</sup> May Town Twinning 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Reception
- 15<sup>th</sup> May Mayor Choosing ceremony
- 19<sup>th</sup> May 2<sup>nd</sup> Guildhall wedding

Since obtaining the license in February 2018 the Guildhall has been the venue for four civil weddings and to date five more are booked for 2019.

May also saw the Town Council host a Civic Reception for guests from Sasso Marconi to mark the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the twinning between the two towns. The actual anniversary was 5<sup>th</sup> October and the Mayor visited Sasso Marconi to mark the occasion. Sadly, on 14<sup>th</sup> March this year Maura Vigorelli passed away. Maura was a stalwart supporter of twinning and worked tirelessly in Italy arranging visits and exchanges. In her memory the Town Council and Helston & District Town Twinning Association jointly purchased a bench located opposite the Sunken Garden in Coinage Ope.

Very topical at the moment are environmental issues such as climate change and single-use plastic pollution. Helston is doing its bit to combat these issues locally. The Town Council has listened to the concerns of local residents and with their assistance has created the Helston Climate Action Group (HCAG) and the Plastic Free Helston Steering Group. The HCAG has established a number of Working Groups that have been meeting to contribute to an over-arching Strategy for publication in September.

The Plastic Free Helston Group has created a Facebook page <https://www.facebook.com/plasticfreehelston/>.

For Flora Day 2019 the Town Council requested that street traders consider their use of single-use plastics and members of the Plastic Free Helston Steering Group visited each stall and awarded a certificate to those that were plastic-free or working towards being plastic-free.

The Town Council has recycled paper and used batteries for many years and purchases street furniture made from recycled materials. For Flora Day, following a public vote ratio of 4:1, the Town Council banned the sale of helium balloons because the balloon does not break down after use and the helium is a limited natural resource.



In April 2018 the Council recruited its first Grounds/General Maintenance Operative – Ian Moore. So impressed with Ian’s work and the public’s response, two further Operatives were appointed this April. The small team is responsible for maintaining all of the Town Council’s play areas and open spaces, three roundabouts (and drawing up plans for the remaining two) and St Michael’s churchyard. The Town Council is also in talks with Cornwall Highways about taking over the cutting of Helston’s grass verges. Cormac Solutions Ltd deserves a special mention for allowing the Town Council space in its Water Ma Trout Compound for our new vehicle and equipment.



Early 2019 saw the Council’s Amenities Committee reverse a decision due to local residents opposition to the installation of play equipment designed for under eight year olds at Trenethick Avenue. The Committee had agreed to the play equipment in principle and was ready to obtain designs for public consultation and begin the process of applying for grant funding. However, the majority of nearby residents objected to the project and following a public meeting the Committee reluctantly agreed to abandon the project.

Last year saw the Town Council create its first Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) with assistance from Cornwall Highways and Cormac Solutions. The TRO Working Party considered a number of requests from residents for schemes to make Helston’s roads safer for everyone. Mainly requests are for yellow lines to prevent inconsiderate parking and to assist the view of drivers. The second tranche of improvements is awaiting review by a Highways officer prior to going to design stage and public consultation.

Finally, resulting from an Electoral Review by the Boundary Commission for England, Helston will be losing a Cornwall Councillor from 2021 as the total number of councillors drops from 123 to 87. From the next elections in May 2021 Helston will have two Cornwall Councillors. Following this, Cornwall Council began a Community Governance Review of town and parish councils. Helston Town Council has requested that the town boundary be extended to include the HX1 residential development on the Falmouth Road and to increase its number of councillors to 14 to help ease the loss of the Cornwall Councillor from 2021.
