
Message from the Mayor

Last month I attended many of the various remembrance activities around Helston. I was delighted to be invited to the launch the annual Poppy Appeal at Tesco on 30th October. Jenny Harvey has been the local organiser for several years and has had an outstanding level of success. Since 2014 Jenny and her team have raised nearly £150,000 through their efforts. This also reflects on the generosity of our local community and the strong bond that there is with our service community at Culdrose. This close link was further emphasised when I attended the ceremony on 11th November, which was marked with 2 minutes silence. Many children from our local primary schools came to mark the occasion. Both the events on Remembrance Sunday had a wonderful attendance including representatives from many local organisations including schools, cadet, scouts, public services and veterans. After the event last year where there were only a handful of people because of the Covid restrictions it was reassuring to see nearly 500 people at Sunday's event.

The community of Helston have also been volunteering to support the excellent Covid Vaccination Centre at Helston AFC on Mondays and Tuesdays. This centre has been providing both booster jabs as well as first and second jabs for those not fully vaccinated. The centre deals with both booked appointments, available via the NHS booking site and with walk ins. The process is well organised and is supported by some volunteer marshals organised by the Helston Lizard Rotary club, with additional

volunteers from both the Helston and Cober Valley clubs. Well done to everyone who has helped this to happen. You are making our community safer and reducing the burden on our very stretched local NHS. Christmas will soon be upon us.

Grounds Maintenance Reflection on 2021

This year the Council's Maintenance Team kept our playparks and verges to a high standard and have received many positive comments from residents on the condition and appearance of the town.

Throughout the year the Maintenance Team have worked tirelessly to keep up with the verges, roundabouts and playparks, with the verges being maintained every 4 weeks. Preparation for the Sainsburys roundabout which was sponsored by Trevena Cross started in May for planting in June. Trevena Cross kindly donated the Delosperma, Yucca and Aloes to make the roundabout so pleasing to the eye and a big thanks goes to them for their assistance with this project.

During the year the team also undertook extensive maintenance on the Falmouth Road, Redruth Road and the Rugby Club roundabouts including weeding, cutting back and replanting to keep them looking well presented.

In the summer the first wildflower areas were planted and have taken well. The team have already started seeding and topping up the existing areas for a good display next year and are planning wildflower displays for Her Majesty the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. The Council is pleased with how these projects are progressing.

The Maintenance Team also assisted with the installation, removal and watering of over 70 baskets to businesses within the town centre. These baskets were planted by the team at Kehelland Trust and the proceeds raised went towards the Helston Mayor's Fund. They looked amazing and certainly brightened up the town.

A special mention to Erica and Dee, two of our volunteers, who kindly give up their time to maintain the sunken garden and other flower beds keeping them looking pretty.

Unfortunately, this year has seen a significant rise in vandalism which has kept the team busy. They have been able to fix many of the breakages themselves, however specialist tradespeople have had to be called to repair severe damage.

The Grounds Maintenance Team are now concentrating on jobs that are going to make specific areas more aesthetically pleasing. The bowling green area will be pressure washed to remove moss and sap stains, bulbs have been planted in the bowling green beds some plants which were looking tired have been removed prior to replacement in the New Year.

This year Helston Town Council's Grounds Maintenance Team have worked extremely hard and we hope that you all are reaping the benefits.

Grant Funding



Helston Town Council has a budget for grant funding available to local organisations for specific projects which benefit a group of people within Helston.

Grant applications are considered twice a year with the next meeting taking place on 17th February 2022. We have £4,615 remaining in the budget so please get in touch to submit an application. Collections will remain unchanged this year, rubbish & recycling will be collected as usual on the bank holidays for 27th & 28th December 2021 and 3rd January 2022.

Arrangement for collecting <u>real</u> Christmas Trees: Non-artificial Christmas Trees under 6ft will be

collected in early January. Place your tree near your rubbish bin on the opposite week to your recycling for free collection-it will be shredded and composted. Residents should cut trees into two if they are taller than 6ft.

Vehicle Activated Speed Signs



Helston Town Council has purchased two vehicle activated speed signs that enable us to gather information which is shared with other agencies to determine whether any other measures are required to deal with speeding. While most drivers are conscientious about their speed it is hoped they will provide a reminder to drivers about the speed limits.

In July our Mayor, Tim Grattan-Kane and Cornwall Councillors Mike

Thomas and Guy Foreman (pictured) officially launched our mobile speed activated signs at Trengrouse Way.

These signs have been moved around the town and have stayed at each location for at least 2 weeks before being moved on to the next.

· Wendron Street · Trengrouse Way · Redruth Road · Porthleven Road

· Meneage Street · Falmouth Road · Cross Street · Furry Way
