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Highlights of the Year



The Town Council's Grounds Maintenance Team continue to maintain many of the verges in Helston on behalf of Cornwall Council. This has also provided the Council with greater control over how the verges are maintained allowing the introduction of longer areas of grass on some of the wider verges to provide a habitat for wildlife. As a trial, wildflower beds were included near junctions in several areas to aid pollinators and following their success these were extended during the course of the year with further wildflower beds planned for the future.

Following concerns with the speed of traffic in a number of areas around Helston the Town Council have invested in a pair of vehicle activated speed signs.

Election and Mayor Choosing

The elections for Helston Town Councillors took place on 6th May 2021 and resulted in an uncontested election for Helston North Ward and a contested election for Helston South Ward. Due to changes from the latest Community Governance Review the number of Councillors on Helston Town Council increased on this date from 12 to 14. On 20th May 2022, at the first physical Town Council meeting since the start of the pandemic, the Council elected Councillor Tim Grattan-Kane as Town Mayor for the 2021/22 civic year. Councillor Kenchington was elected Deputy Mayor at the same meeting.



Helston Community Interest Company, in partnership with Helston Town Council, were successful in bidding for Town Vitality Funding from Cornwall Council in November 2021. The funding was awarded to assist with the development of a number of place shaping projects designed to benefit Helston's town centre. A Place Shaping Board made up of local volunteers was created to oversee the project development and this board includes representation from Helston Town Council. The work carried out by the Board has put Helston in the position to submit a bid to the Government's Levelling Fund for capital works with a decision awaited in October. In a ground-breaking initiative officers and members from Helston Town Council participated in a day of Climate and Ecological Emergency Literacy training with facilitators from the University of Exeter and Volunteer Cornwall. The objective of the training, which was designed in collaboration with the Town Council, was to raise awareness of the multitude of issues within the climate emergency and how even a small council can undertake simple steps to address the many challenges faced.

Roundabouts



The Grounds Maintenance Team have planted up a further two roundabouts within the town. Firstly, they have enhanced the 'Sainsbury' roundabout with a selection of plants including Delosperma, Yucca and Aloes kindly provided by Trevena Cross Nurseries as part of their sponsorship. The team have also improved the Grange Road Roundabout with a design that incorporates ornamental grasses, Gaura, Echinacea, Coreopsis, Geranium Rozanne and Napeta.

Welcome Back Funding

The Town Council were successful in securing a grant up to £28,000 from the Welcome Back Fund which was administered by Cornwall Council and supported entirely by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF). This grant allowed the Town Council to fund several different events held by external organisations including: Kickstart Helston Music

- St Piran's Day: Community Heritage Project Lantern Procession
- Henry Trengrouse celebrations
- Kickstart Helston Theatre
- The Ballad of Bob Fitzsimmons

In addition the funding provided added publicity for the Council's St Piran's Day: Pasties & Hevva Cakes competition and the Love Helston Photography competition with the winning entries being made

Youth Work Support

Members are concerned with the health and wellbeing of young people within our community who have been particularly affected by the pandemic. They have experienced increased isolation and require greater access to support. For this reason, in a joint project with Porthleven Town Council, we contracted Young People Cornwall to offer detached youth worker provision in the town which commenced in the summer of 2022.



How the Council Works

Helston Town Council was formed in 1974 and consists of 14 elected Councillors, 8 Councillors represent Helston North and 6 Councillors represent Helston South. The Councillors are elected by local residents to represent the Parish of Helston for a four year term with the latest election taking place in May 2021. Councillors do not receive payment or any allowance for attending meetings or for carrying out Council business.

The Full Council meets on the third Thursday of every month, excluding August, to oversee the activities of the Council. In addition to the Full Council meetings, the Council has three committees to facilitate the effective management of its business:

- Amenities
- Planning
- Policy, Finance and Resources

There is public participation at the monthly Full Council meetings to enable members of the public to make comments or to raise local issues relevant to the Town Council. There is also public participation at committee meetings during which comments can be made regarding items on the agenda. The Amenities Committee was Chaired by Cllr Ramsden and met on six occasions during the 2021/22 civic year. The Committee is responsible for the Council's property including the Guildhall and several play areas and open spaces. The Committee also oversees the maintenance of these areas as well as the roundabouts and the majority of verges within the town and provides bus shelters, benches and litter bins.

Planning Committee

The Planning Committee, currently consisting of six Members, meets on the first Thursday of every month and has delegated authority to consider all planning applications and to make recommendations to Cornwall Council - the Planning Authority. All Applications are categorised into those that are non-contentious (Category I) and those that require more in-depth consideration (Category II). Each Category II application is allocated to a Committee member who visits the site and contacts neighbours to establish a balanced view and to make a presentation and a recommendation at the Planning Committee meeting. If a near neighbour of the application site cannot be contacted a letter is left giving the application details and how to contact the Committee Member. The public are welcome to attend the meeting and have the opportunity to express their opinions to the Members.


From June 2021 to May 2022, 52 Category I and 41 Category II planning applications were considered.

Policy, Finance and Resources Committee

The Policy, Finance and Resources Committee, consisting of eight Members, Chaired by Councillor Grattan-Kane, met on seven occasions during the year with meetings initially held on the Tuesday of the week prior to Full Council and then moving to the Monday of the same week.

The Committee's functions include reviewing existing Council policies and risk assessments and the consideration of new policies. With regard to finance, the Committee regularly monitors the budget and considers reports of the independent internal auditor and the external auditor. Two members of the Committee regularly conduct audits of internal controls.

The Committee agrees a draft forward budget and determines the Precept for recommendation to Full Council each year.

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

Our Services



Bus Shelters

Bus shelters are a vital facility when waiting for the bus in bad weather and the Town Council is pleased to provide and maintain eight bus shelters within the town.



Footpaths

Helston Town Council cuts over 5,000m of footpath on behalf of Cornwall Council's Countryside Access Team. The Town Council's maintenance team carries out either one or two cuts a year depending on the grade of footpath in accordance with Cornwall Council's maintenance specification.



Litter Bins

The Town Council provides 24 litter bins located around the town centre and in our play areas and open spaces. These bins supplement those provided by Cornwall Council.



CCTV

The Town Council funds eleven public realm CCTV within Helston. The cameras are linked to the Fire and Rescue Centre HQ at Tolvaddon where they are monitored regularly by a team of professionally trained officers.



Grant Funding

Helston Town Council has a limited amount of grant funding which is available to local organisations. Grant applications are usually considered twice a year at the September and February Full Council meetings.



Open Spaces

The Town Council maintains numerous open spaces within the town including Monument Walk, the Sunken Garden, the Trengrouse Way Amenity Area (near Helston Library) and the WWI Garden to name a few



Planning

Whilst Cornwall Council is the Planning
Authority who makes the ultimate
decision the Town Council is a consultee
and is notified of all applications for
planning permission within the town. The
Town Council makes recommendations to
Cornwall Council which are taken into
consideration by them when making the
decision.



Public Conveniences

Due to budgetary constraints at Cornwall Council, the Town Council took over responsibility Public Conveniences in Helston. Three premises are provided at the Guildhall, Trengrouse Way and Monument Walk and since their transfer the Town Council extended their opening times to 8am to 6pm 364 days a year.



Represent Helston

Helston Town Council is a statutory body and is the most local level of government. It has an important role in promoting the town, representing its interests and supporting the work of different groups in the community.



Play Areas

The Town Council owns and leases a total of five equipped play areas around Helston. The Town Council is responsible for the maintenance of these areas and has a regular inspection routine in place.



Public Seats

The Town Council provides 62 benches across the town. It also provides 9 picnic benches in various play areas and open spaces.





Verges

The Town Council currently maintains 66,000 sqm of verges around Helston on behalf of Cornwall Council. This has allowed the Town Council greater control over the appearance of the town and to make adjustments for greater biodiversity.


