MERCHANT NAVY DAY

Merchant Navy Day was held on Saturday the 3rd September with The Guildhall raising the Red Ensign on Monday 5th September in honour of the brave men and women locally who are, or have been, Merchant Seamen. During both World Wars they helped keep the “island afloat” and now they are responsible for 95% of the UK’s imports, including half the food we eat, plenty of fuel we rely on and virtually all the products and goods we tend to take for granted.

The Red Ensign, or “Red Duster” as it is affectionately known, has been the recognised flag of the British Merchant Navy since 1854 and was flown from 600 locations across the country by parish, community, town, city, district and borough councils.



CIVIC SUNDAY

On Sunday 10th July, the Mayor of Helston, Freemen and Councillors along with HTC staff processed to St Michael's Church to take part in the annual Civic Sunday. Local community groups and organisations were invited to the church service where refreshments were served afterwards in the Andrew Hall.
