The Deputy Mayor gave apologies on behalf of Councillor Grattan-Kane (Town Mayor) who was unwell. The Deputy Mayor then presented a resume of the affairs of the town during the preceding twelve months on behalf of the Mayor which made special reference to:

- (a) the difficult time being experienced by residents and businesses, thanking the public for their response in volunteering with the Emergency Response Team.
  With special mention to Helston Rotary Club & Helston Football club for their aid during the Covid response measures;
- (b) the town's appreciation for the work of key workers and the NHS. Thanking the Furry Café, Cathy Sherlock of Culdrose Community Centre and the Methodist Youth clubs run by Sarah Reed for their voluntary efforts in Youth Engagement in response to the rise in youth anti-social and criminal behaviour;

- (c) the continued provision of Hanging Baskets within the town by the Mayors Welfare Fund in response to the cessation of the Helston in Bloom Group.
- (d) The return of Flora Day which was eagerly awaited, thanking all those involved in the preparation including the Rotary Clubs which helped refurbish the white wash walls around the town;
